

Annual Glock Raffle Rules

1. Qualified Participants
 - a. Any member in good standing at the time work is performed
 - b. Any spouse of a member in good standing at the time work is performed
 - c. Any member and/or spouse can receive only 1 raffle entry regardless of work opportunity criteria that is met

2. Qualified Work Opportunities
 - a. Any member (and/or spouse) working 3 or more range workdays
 - b. Any member (and/or spouse) working 3 or more Gun Show workdays
 - c. Any member (and/or spouse) working 3 or more CCW classes (instruction and/or range portions)
 - d. Any member (and/or spouse) serving in a 501c3 or 501c7 Board of Directors position
 - e. Any member (and/or spouse) serving on a board committee and attending 3 or more committee meetings
 - f. Any member (and/or spouse) working in one or more capacities to make the 3 workday requirement

3. Qualification Period
 - a. Calendar Year (January thru December)

4. Accounting
 - a. All participants are responsible for tracking their qualified work hours annually (Including event title and date worked)
 - b. All participants are responsible for reporting their qualified work hours to the 501c7 VP in writing (by email or by letter) no later than January 31 following the end of the qualification period
 - c. The 501c7 VP collect all eligible names, confirm participation as necessary and will coordinate the drawing
 - d. Annual drawing is to be held at the February general membership meeting

5. Scenarios
 - a. Member A works 2 range workdays and instructs at a CCW class during the calendar year. This member is eligible for the drawing having worked a total of 3 workdays although the workdays were in different qualifying events.
 - b. Member B works 6 range days in one year and his wife works each time with him. Both Member B and his spouse are eligible (only one entry each) for the drawing.
 - c. Member C is a BOD member and works 3 CCW classes during the year. His wife is assisted at the range portion of 2 CCW classes and helped him with his BOD duties throughout the year. Member C is eligible (only one entry) and his spouse is not eligible because assisting a BOD member is not a qualified work event.
